Launched in 1994, the WHE Programme provides young people with the necessary knowledge, skills, network and commitment to become involved in heritage protection from local to global levels. New pedagogical approaches are developed to mobilize young people to participate actively in the promotion of World Heritage.

Co-ordinating Committee for International Voluntary Service

The Co-ordinating Committee for International Voluntary Service was created in 1948 under the aegis of UNESCO as a global platform to coordinate International Voluntary Service. CCIVS maintains "Formal Relations of Association" with UNESCO. Based at UNESCO HQ in Paris, CCIVS communicates with members and branches in more than one hundred countries.

o World Heritage Volunteers



The World Heritage Volunteers initiative consists of two complementary activities: the Patrimonito workcamps and developing a World Heritage Non-Formal Education (NFE) kit for use of those wishing to implement pedagogical activities outside the formal school setting.

Heritage workcamps gather young volunteers from different countries during a given period of time to live and work together with the local population towards a common goal: WH preservation.

The protection of heritage allows volunteers involved in the project to reflect about issues related to preservation, the symbolism of the sites where they work and the way it is embedded in local traditions. Working on a concrete site and reflecting about its past, present and future function allows keeping traditions alive and re-creating lost links.

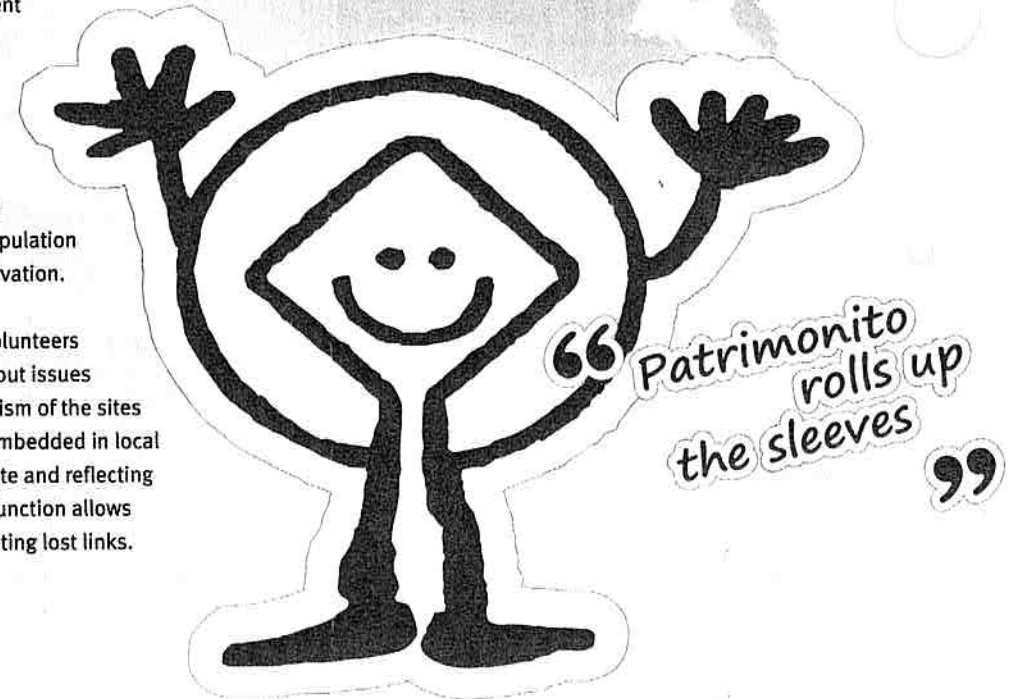

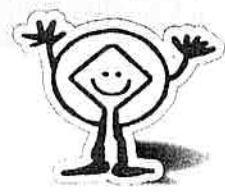
The protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage

The Convention Concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage is an international treaty adopted by the UNESCO General Assembly in 1972, which aims at cataloguing, naming, and conserving sites of outstanding importance to the common heritage of humankind.

While each World Heritage Site is the property of the country on whose territory it is located, it is considered in the interest of the international community to preserve each site for future generations.

There are currently 851 properties inscribed in the World Heritage List located in 142 countries. The protection and conservation of these sites are a concern of all peoples of the world.

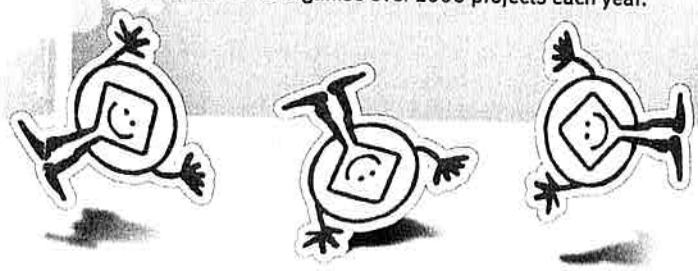
International Voluntary Service

International workcamps are an exchange between a group of volunteers and a community.

The group offers time, energy and efforts to benefit a community while the community offers an opportunity for experimentation, learning, personal and collective development.

International voluntary service projects are organised in different fields such as cultural heritage, environment, education, construction and renovation. Ideally based on the needs of the host community, strong emphasis is put on the contact and dialogue with the local population, which are an integral part of the project itself.

CCIVS members organise over 2000 projects each year.

Patrimonito Workcamps

Patrimonito Workcamps aim at sensitising about World Heritage through the active participation of young people and the local community where the projects take place.

The workcamps will be implemented by international voluntary service organisations that use non-formal education methods. The projects encourage synergies with heritage and education experts as well as governmental agencies and the World Heritage site managers.

Twelve Patrimonito workcamps will be held during summer 2008. They will last between two to four weeks and host between ten to thirty participants from all over the world.
