Intensive Iceland Board Meeting

The EUROCLIO Association Board meeting took place in Reykjavik, Iceland in August 24-26. After a quite difficult summer for most of European countries the meeting in peaceful and autumn weather like Reykjavik was a good and fruitful one. All elected board members were present, plus co-opted member Elbert Roest and Executive Director Joke van der Leeuw-Roord.

The Board meeting took place in a friendly city, and was perfectly organized by our host, EUROCLIO Association President Súsanna Margrét Gestsdóttir. The Board discussed several important issues, such as practical aspects of the next Annual Conferences (2008-2011), focusing mainly in

Bristol 2008 and Cyprus 2009, running and future EUROCLIO projects, EUROCLIO publications, new co operations; we also finalized the new EUROCLIO Foundation and Association Statutes to be approved in next, Bristol's Annual Conference General Assembly, worked on the new EUROCLIO Questionnaire for 2008 and discussed a number of other issues, according to the agenda, about EUROCLIO functioning, such as finances, website, new members, future policy etc. The workload was heavy but the spirit was high and the specialty of the hosting country (the astonishing nature) played an important role in that. The next EUROCLIO board meeting will be held in Bristol (UK), November 30-December 2- 2007.

[Rethinking Education in European Migration Societies, Lisbon 2007.](#)

In April, former EUROCLIO president Manuela Carvalho participated on behalf of EUROCLIO in the third conference of NECE (Networking European Citizenship Education). The title of the conference was Rethinking Education in European Migration Societies. Political Strategies – Social Changes – Educational Concepts. The challenge had been thrown by the German Federal Agency for Civic Education, in cooperation with several other organizations from Austria, France, Poland and Portugal: exchange views, find answers and design effective actions to tackle the complex issues related to the fields of migration and integration. Participants from 29 countries discussed effects and consequences of worldwide migration processes on the future of citizenship education in Europe, raising many issues at the lively debates

[History teaching at the 26th Nordic History Congress 2007.](#)

In the beginning of August, more than 300 Nordic historians met in Reykjavík to introduce research and share thoughts on diverse historical topics. Possibly for the first time in the long history of these congresses (dating back to 1905), history teaching was on the agenda. Professor Þorsteinn Helgason of the Iceland University of Education gathered a large group of specialists from five countries that had focused on textbooks and – among other things – done a survey on the use of textbooks in the North. Participants in the half-day session (among them many Euroclians) split into three groups to look closer at the following subjects: How do texts and knowledge become alive?, Dramatic happenings and Us and others. When meeting again for discussions, people were considerably better informed about the practices in neighbouring countries and there was a general feeling among participants that they would like to see more work on history teaching at future conferences.

[The Forum for the Future of Democracy, Stockholm/Sigtuna 2007.](#)

In June, Súsanna Margrét Gestsdóttir participated on behalf of EUROCLIO in the third session of the Forum for the Future of Democracy, held by the Council of Europe. It was hosted by the Swedish Parliament, the Government of Sweden and the Swedish Associations of Local Authorities and Regions. 350 representatives of INGO's, governments and civil society spent three days discussing the theme "Power and empowerment – the interdependence of democracy and human rights". In the Forum's conclusions, three main ideas were identified: The role and responsibilities of the opposition, the systematic and structured work on Human Rights and Democracy and Empowering the individual through non-discrimination. The next session of the Forum is to take place in Madrid in 2008. It will examine the issue of e-governance and e-democracy.

This seminar resulted from a partnership conference between EUROCLIO- the European Standing Conference of History Teachers' Associations, the VGN- the Dutch History Teacher's Association and the HTEN – the History Teacher Education Network in the UK. It was organised in co-operation with the Graduate School of Teaching and Learning, University of Amsterdam, the Netherlands. It has been financed by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs' BBI-WE programme. The very intensive and informative programme of the two-day seminar offered: Lectures, round table meetings and poster sessions on the professional development of history teacher educators,

history trainees/new teachers and their mentors in schools. In addition there was a discussion on the effects of research on teaching history in the United Kingdom and the Netherlands and how researchers and teachers can contribute to each other's work. Several conclusions that can be drawn centre around the problematic position of history in the (national) school curriculum. Moreover, it seems good to have primary and secondary training together, to have a better understanding of the challenges facing the profession. Participants enjoyed and appreciated this first meeting of UK and Dutch teacher trainers and are discussing the possibilities for future cooperation.

News from the secretariat

Lobby for Common European History Tool grows

Executive Director Joke van der Leeuw-Roord was invited by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs to present the ideas about a Common European Tool / online-textbook on the 5th of July for a mixed audience of interested administrators from that Ministry and from the Ministry of Education. This is the result of intensive letter writing in the follow-up of participation in the Queens Symposia. The idea has been received positively and they have called upon EUROCLIO to map out possible (international) partnerships to extend this idea. A part of this MA programme is "trans-national history", methodical breaking through the national "tunnel vision".

Staff member Jonathan Even-Zohar graduates MA with honor

Inspired by the work and research area that EUROCLIO is dealing with Jonathan decided to work with history textbooks as sources and put together a large quantitative database where detailed information can be traced about any "encounter" with non-western history in the last 35 years of secondary education textbooks. Information about the time, place and theme of the encountered event has been stored. In less than two months time he hopes to be able to present this database online, so that it may be used for further research.  Huibert Crijns, former EUROCLIO staff member, is responsible as Project leader for the digitalisation of the minutes and documents of the Dutch Parliament (Staten Generaal) since 1814. The first results of this project, a co-production of the Dutch Royal Library and the Dutch Second Chamber are now available on internet. Huibert Crijns, presented the website by asking the Dutch President of the Second Chamber, Ms Gerdi Verbeet, to carry out a reach task on the website. She had to compete with traditional but very experienced users of the written minutes. This small exercise was won without any problem by Ms Verbeet and made all present aware how unique and far reaching the accomplishments of this new site are. Well attended international meeting in Riga, Latvia, 6 to 9 September

The Latvian History Teachers' Association brought together 70 representatives from 11 (Nordic) countries to discuss What do we teach about our neighbours? In his key-note speech the director of the Latvian Institute Ojars Kalnins, explored the role of history in the branding of the nation. The presentations of all countries showed that school history in 2007 tries on a lesser or larger scale to contribute to that objective. Some presentations, such as the one from Belarus, demonstrated how urgent the national questions still is in their teaching of history. The presentations also showed that some topics such as the Vikings and the Winter War in Finland feature in each curriculum. Teaching about Russia and its international policy was in all countries prominent and in general it received a negative staging. However one of the Russian presentations emphasised how their own teaching contributed to this negative image: it describes its attitude towards its neighbours predominantly as

target for territorial expansion and wars. Further the audience became aware that Iceland does not feature very often in the Nordic teaching and that Belarus does, except in their own textbooks, non exist in school history. EUROCLIO presented examples of work on supra national school history and shared with the audience its idea to create a common interactive tool for school history. The participants decided that the seminar had been very useful and the delegation from Denmark offered to explore possibilities organising the event next year.

New collaboration in the United States Institute of Peace-EUROCLIO project “Retelling the History of a New Nation” in Macedonia with USAID

Although the main focus of USAID-partner-project is Math and Science, there is a sharing of a common goal of improving pedagogy and meeting the demands of an emerging democracy. In particular, within the ICT in Education component, the collaboration will be promoting the use of ICT within

the subject of history. Two opportunities for cooperation have been identified:

1. Working to promote the use of the MoES Education Portal and assisting the History Teachers Association to make available, on the Portal, the resources developed through the project. This will enable all schools to make use of these materials.
2. Inviting members of the History Association to participate in the training of teachers from the Pilot Schools where the use of ICT in History is monitored.

Next to this collaboration we can state that the potential of cooperation in the Albanian-Macedonian region for History Education becomes more and more visible. A detailed report on the intensive multi-ethnic and multi-lingual workshop that has been held from 1-3 September will be published on the website within the coming weeks.

E.M.H. Hirsch Ballin. On that day the WRR will also see published “exploration national identity and plural past” (Amsterdam AUP/WRR 2007) by prof.dr. Maria Grever (EUR) and dr. Kees Ribbens (EUR/NIOD). This research supports the WRR report in the analysis of the importance and the restrictions of the national history as a source for identification, in particular of young people in the Netherlands (Rotterdam), the United Kingdom (London) and France (Lille).
